Uniform

All items of uniform/clothing must be labelled with your child's name as we gather many lost/mixed up items throughout the year!

PE kits

PE kits are available for sale from the website above. The school PE kit consists of a t shirt and hoody in house colours, black shorts and black plimsolls. Joggers (navy or black) and trainers are required for outside PE activities and cross country. A school PE kit looks professional and is line with our ethos and policy on school uniform. A PE kit should be in school every day. Hair should be tied up and jewellery (including earrings) is not permitted for PE activities. If PE kit is not in school your child will not be able to participate in the PE lesson.

Playtimes

We are asking that children who would like to go on the field at playtimes (Years 2 - 5) have a spare pair of (old) joggers/trousers and trainers/shoes to change into as they can get very muddy. Please put these clothes in a named bag to hang on your child's peg. Thank you.

Be Skilled Trust

We continue to work with our collaborative trust schools – St Botolph's, Long Whatton, Diseworth and Oxley. We have a packed programme for the year benefitting pupils, staff and governors.

Our first event is a Festival of Sport for Year 2 children on September 5th at Diseworth School. Letters have gone out to those involved.

On September 28th there will be a Dualthlon day at Hick's Lodge – in the morning for Year 2 and 3 children, in the afternoon for Year 4 and 5 children and after school for our Year 6 children.

Letters have been given to interested children. If your child would like to take part they need to hand in a completed application form by September 8th. This is a very popular event so please encourage your child to think about what they can offer and why they want to enter, before they complete the form.

Responsibilities

Next week there will be opportunities for our pupils to apply for a variety of 'jobs' and responsibilities around school such as school council representatives and house Captains.

School Meals

These are free for our Tigers and Owls. The cost for a school meal for the Bears and the Sea Otters is £2.20 per day -£11.00 each week. You can pay weekly or half termly. Please send the money to school in a named envelope. Cheques are payable to LCC – Belton Primary School. Thank you!

It is important that parental permission is sought for attendance at clubs and also we need to know if your child is not able to attend on a particular day. This is a safeguarding issue. We will text you if your child has not been successful with a place in a club of their choice.
