Christmas cards:

Children can bring in Christmas cards for their friends and teachers in all classes.

There will however need to be a strict timescale

Each classroom will have a 'post' box for Christmas cards.

- All cards must be put in their own classroom box.
- Cards must not be handed personally to their friends
- Cards can be posted into their classroom post box from TUESDAY 1ST December until the final posting day of WEDNESDAY 9th December.
- Cards will be left in their class post boxes until Monday 14th December which will be card delivery day

The cards will be sorted by the staff who will have sanitised their hands both before and during sorting the cards and who will follow all COVID-19 guidelines

When your children are writing cards, please make sure they have washed their hands thoroughly before they begin and that they DO NOT lick envelopes - preferably tucking in the flaps.

If you really do not want your child to receive a card, please let your child's class teacher know.
