We have begun our practising for this important traditional school and village event. It is traditional for girls to wear white dresses with a cardigan if necessary and boys to wear grey shorts/trousers, white shirt, red tie, and a grey jumper if required. Year 5 girls and the May Queen will also have a headdress of flowers, provided by FOBS. As part of the tradition only Year 5 girls have flowers in their hair. We do encourage the re-cycling of good quality clothes so as not to incur too much expense. We will have some dresses for sale at school and if you have any outgrown items for resale please bring them into school as soon as possible.

Red ties can be purchased from the office for £2. All children (except for Year 5 boys and girls) will require a may stick. The girls in Class A also require a posy. For a may stick you will need a 1 metre cane, doily and white ribbon for a bow. There will be a meeting for all parents new to May Day, details to come.

On May Day, children should assemble at 1.45pm on the school playground ready to be part of the procession to leave at 2pm prompt to walk to the Maypole in the centre of the village. We will then have the crowning of this year's May Queen followed by the dancing. The dancers are then invited to take part in a children's tea party at school where there will also be a Spring Fayre, all organised by FOBS. More details from FOBS soon.
