PUPIL PREMIUM

If you are in receipt of any of the following the school can access extra funding which really helps us and benefits all pupils as well as individuals

- ·Income Support
- ·Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- ·Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- ·Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- ·The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- ·Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- ·Working Tax Credit run-on -paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- ·Universal Credit -if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Other pupils eligible for pupil premium grant include children who have been looked after by the local authority and Service children.
