I can't believe we are now at May half term! It has been nice to have the sun back again the last few days and I understand that it is set to be sunny during the half term break! The children have had a busy half term, getting used to being back in school. They have all been wonderful. I am so lucky to have a school full of such amazing children.

Covid

I understand that there has been a question regarding why at Belton we have not stopped asking parents to wear masks in the playground, following a letter from the local authority saying they are not requesting it anymore. As Headteacher, I am responsible for the school risk assessment regarding Covid and it is my duty to make sure I feel it is right for our school.

The day after the local authority letter was sent to me, information about the growing amount of Indian variant cases in the local area was released. Due to this, taking into account the demographic of parents who may not have had access to the vaccine as yet, the amount of general illness in school currently and the timing (being close to half term) I wanted to remain cautious. I planned to review this weekly and will continue to do so, particularly as I know a local school has had to close a bubble this week and rates are now rising again.

Everything I have done during this crisis has been with the best of intentions for the children, staff and parents, to keep as many of us safe as possible. Behind the scenes there is an awful lot of work carried out and decisions that have to be made. I thank you for your understanding and please speak to me if there is a problem.

Please note **during half term** I am **still** responsible for reporting any cases so if your child does have symptoms, for example a cough, loss / change of taste or smell, high temperature or if you are in any doubt, please get them tested. **If they do test positive please inform me via WEDUC**. Tests currently are back in a day. **I can only accept a PCR test.**
