When there are staff absences there are of course changes how things work in school and has slowed down the process of being able to send out the new reading books for KS2- we will get there.

As I mentioned during whole school assembly this morning, this year I will represent Belton on Remembrance Sunday and lay the wreath on behalf of the school.

Regarding the National Lockdown. The class clubs currently will continue as part of childcare. However, they are under review. If the children need to come inside for the club due to the weather it will be cancelled. We will try to give you as much notice as possible.

On this point, we had worked out a way to do Nativity but due to the new restrictions it won't be able to happen. Tigers and Owls will do their own performances, which will be videoed and sent home for you to see, (hopefully!). # Remembrance Sunday in Belton will be different this year



This year, there will simply be an Act of Remembrance at the war memorial with

the laying of wreaths. This will begin at 10.50am. We are not able to hold a parade beforehand, nor an open church service afterwards.

A representative of the British Legion, the Parish Council, the church, the school, St. John Ambulance and the uniform organisations will gather by the memorial to lay wreaths, read out the names and hold the 2 minute silence.

Ways we can mark Remembrance Sunday in Belton:

- Put a poppy in your window or on your gatepost,
- Stand on your driveway or in your doorway to listen out for the church clock and mark our Remembrance together as a street at 11am,



- Watch the events at the village memorial live on a facebook livestream (details to follow),
- Tune in to the national remembrance event on radio or tv,
- We would ask that if you do come as a spectator to the marketplace you keep at a distance and observe the rule of 6.

Meths Week England Ruck Out 2020





Dear Parent/Carer of Lions and Sea otters

As part of our commitment to make maths exciting and high profile in our school, this November we are taking part in a competition for Maths Week England. It's called Rock Out 2020 and it's all done online via play.ttrockstars.com.

For every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, your child will earn their class a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours). Winning classes in the school and in the country as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

All game modes (Gig, Garage, Studio, etc.) will count but only from games played between 7.30am and 7.30pm on Monday 9<sup>th</sup>, Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup>, Thursday 12<sup>th</sup>, Friday 13<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 14<sup>th</sup>.

In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf but by all means encourage and support them to the extent that it doesn't cause high stress levels or impact on family plans. We suggest a limit of half an hour a day outside school hours – some will play more, some will play less.
