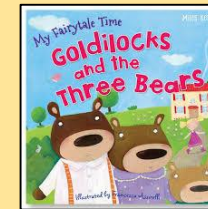
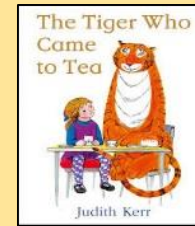
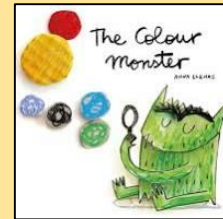
Literacy

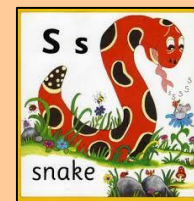
Mathematics

Communication and Language

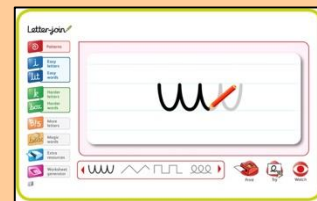
Listen during Carpet time and follow simple instructions.

PE –Football and ball manipulation

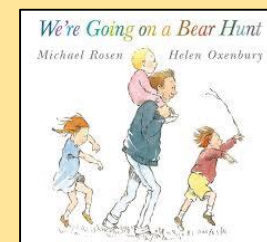
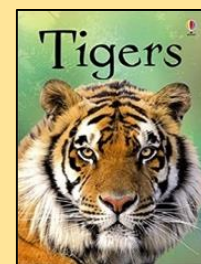

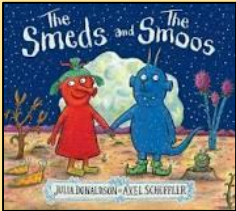
