"Please can we come back?"

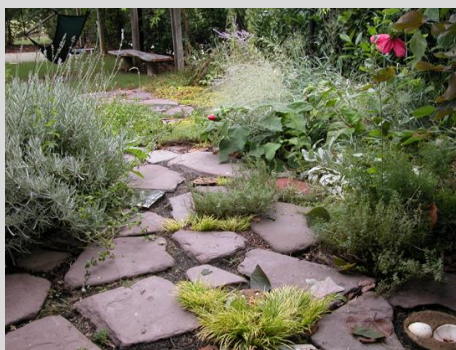


### Parent Forum
