

Belton Update 16th October 2020

We made it to half term!!!

I can't believe that it is October half term! When we came back to school in August it seemed such a long way off but here we are! The Tigers don't seem so little anymore and are part of the furniture. It has been great to see them settle in to school life.

Lunches

After half term we will be moving to have the option of school packed lunches or hot grab bags (see menu on WEDUC). The children will still eat in the classrooms, apart from Tigers who will continue to eat in the hall. This routine is working well.

Washing hands outside

Hand washing on entry is really important, when the weather is really cold or wet we do have another system in place, so please do not worry.

(Key Stage 2 only -Lions and Sea Otters)

Due to how lunch time works with keeping the bubbles apart we have noticed that sometimes the children are coming back in with wet feet. After half term the children in Sea Otters and Lions only, can bring in an extra pair of socks, plimsolls or slippers (only sensible slippers please with backs etc.) to pop on if their shoes and trainers are wet.

Ventilation

I did send a note out on WEDUC regarding the windows and doors being open for ventilation. The guidance is clear that we need to do this but it will be proportional to the weather. Please **do** put an extra jumper in their bag etc. in case they are cold. This hasn't been a problem so far but as it gets colder we need to continue to be prepared.

Water bottles and bags

I have noticed that there are some children bringing juice to school in their water bottle. Unless there is a medical need there should be no juice, just water. Also there should be no big rucksacks in school. Thank you.

Parents evening

It was a very different way to do parents evening. I do hope you found it useful to talk to the teachers. We have noticed that since lockdown that the children's reading and reading comprehension and times tables particularly in KS2 are not as strong (generally) as they were. Please



keep working on these areas at home. After half term, Mr Goldsmith will be joining us for 1 day a week to work with KS2 on their Maths, as part of our commitment to catch up.

I will be totally honest - I have not got a clue on how this will all work as yet, but we are thinking about it and hoping we will be able to do something, even if it isn't the usual celebrations and performances we are used to. It is on our radar!
