The BeSkilled Trust Duathlon Challenge

Following on from a very successful Duathlon challenge last year some of our children have applied to take part in another one on 11th April. It will be held at Hicks Lodge in Ashby. The challenge involves two back to back events that give a total of 5 miles of ground to be covered - a four mile off road cycle challenge and a 1 mile run around the lake. The Year six competitors compete in three back to back events over 10 miles. The first is a four mile off road cycle challenge followed by a 1 mile run, followed by a timed bike ride around the lake which involves the children completing as many laps as they can within 30 minutes.
