

Belton Update

24th September 2021

Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

It has been a rollercoaster of a couple weeks, with high child and staff absence but I am pleased to say currently it looks like the outbreak has slowed for us. I have contacted the Health Protection Team and we can lift our restrictions next week.

Regarding Harvest, it will still take place but I can't confirm if we can have an audience and therefore won't be able to give much notice. I have to react to the current picture in school. If not, I am sure I can persuade Miss North to use her videoing skills once again!

This week I have also sent out the proposed Homework Policy for consultation. Please do look at it and let me know your thoughts, even if it is to say it looks alright to you! WEDUC message or email to the office with 'Homework Policy Consultation' as its title - it will run to the 8th October.

As I've mentioned before, this year we will be taking part in the Schools Linking Project, where some classes will be linking up with contrasting schools in Leicestershire.

Yesterday, Miss North went on some training to start our School Linking Project. The Squirrels will be making links with the Lemur class at Linden Primary School in Leicester. Over the Autumn Term Squirrels will learn more about the children from their partner school and be able to share who they are and some special things about them. The first activity they will do is the classes will exchange bunting which will include a drawing of themselves, a fun fact and their name. A few weeks later the children will make information maps about themselves and their identity so that they can compare their likes and dislikes with the children in the Lemur class. Towards the end of the term the classes will get to meet virtually where they will answer questions about their lives and school. They may even get to play a few games like Pictionary and Charades! At Belton we want our children to understand and experience the lives of other people so they can understand the diversity of the world around them.

The rest of the teachers will be meeting with the teachers from the schools for training in the coming weeks. It is an exciting project, that I first did in Bradford, when I first started teaching.
