Sometimes headteachers get it wrong!

As you will be aware I have a duty to monitor attendance and attendance letters are used routinely at most schools. I hoped to help highlight to parents/carers that their child's attendance is currently sitting below the expected %. All absences, whether authorized or unauthorized do count within these percentages. I am mindful there was lots of illness towards the end of the Autumn term and this may be the cause of some children's absence, which will mean hopefully their % will improve as the year progresses.
