Every year I write a school improvement plan to focus on key areas to keep improving the school. Here is a brief overview of the main areas we are working on this year.

### **Behaviour Policy**

Last term, as you know, after consolation, we updated our Positive Behaviour policy. Please see the school website for a copy if you want to refresh your memory.

As part of the new policy children may be involved in taking part in restorative conversations, where appropriate, with staff and the involved children as needed. This is to really did deep on the issue and work out solutions together. As part of this process it might be that the teacher does not do this until the day after the issue so that everyone has time to calm down, think and reflect.

Please remember this is your child comes home and says there has been an issue but hasn't been 'dealt with'. Odds are it will be the next day.

# PE Kit

### A polite reminder of what we expect in terms of PE kit

## For PE all children need

Indoor PE

- plain round neck T shirt in house colour red, green, blue and yellow
- black / navy blue shorts
- black plimsolls
- drawstring bag (clearly labelled with child's name)

### Outdoor PE: (KS1 & 2 pupils)

- a hoodie (plain in house colour red, green, blue and yellow)
- black or navy-blue tracksuit/jogging bottoms/leggings
- trainers

### Swimming (KS2)

- above the knee swimming trunk/shorts (boys)
- one piece swimming costume (girls)
- towel
- hairbrush or comb
- goggles (a permission slip must be signed by parents/carers if goggles are to be worn)
- plain swimming hats, as appropriate

Parents/carers should note the swimming and PE is a compulsory part of the curriculum and all children are required to participate.

### Additional optional items

- book bag
- drawstring PE bag
- waterproof fleece with hood

### **Extreme Weather**

Children should dress appropriately for extreme weather conditions. In the summer it is vital that children have a protective sun hat or cap. Sun cream should be applied to children before they arrive at school on hot summer days. Boots and sufficiently warm waterproof coats should be provided in wet and snowy weather. In severe weather, it is perfectly acceptable/sensible for both boys and girls to wear suitable outdoor clothing/footwear to and from school and to put on for outside playtime. Pupils will, however, be expected to remove or change such items inside school.
