Welcome back to a new academic year and to our sparkling school. Our staffing remains the same this term although there are some changes to make you aware of. As Class A are such a large group we have decided to split the class and have now got two learning areas for them. Reception children (who we will start welcoming into school from this afternoon) will be in the main Class A classroom all day with Mrs Jones, Mrs Hopkins and Ms Smith. Year 1 children are going to benefit from a new exciting area 'the beehive' which comprises of the ex-library and the hall where they will be able to have focused English and Maths lessons. In the afternoon the whole class will be in the classroom, outdoor classroom and the 'forest area.'



The Class A classroom has been transformed in the holiday and special thanks need to go to Mrs Jones (and family) who has worked so hard over the summer making the classrooms so inviting for the children. Mrs Hopkins has added to the values mural in our entrance and we are going to add British values to this shortly.

Other staffing news is that Mrs Keast is going to have a baby and will probably be leaving school in February, the due date being the beginning of March.

Uniform

The children look very smart in their uniforms and are a credit to yourselves and the school. We are asking that all children wear school uniform each day. If a sweatshirt or cardigan or fleece is worn it **must** have the school logo on. Sew on badges can be sourced from the school office free of charge. Mrs Smith has uniform stocks in the office for you to purchase, please purchase as you need. Uniform order forms are available on the schools website or in the office. All items of uniform/clothing must be labelled with your child's name as we gather many lost/mixed up items throughout the year! There is also an amount of used clothing at school in very good condition at very low prices and we do encourage recycling.

PE kits

PE kits are available for sale in the office. The school PE kit consists of a white t shirt with the school logo on and black shorts with black plimsolls. Joggers (navy or black) and trainers are useful for outside PE activities and cross country. A school PE kit looks professional and is in line with our ethos and policy on school uniform. A PE kit should be in school every day. Hair should be tied up and jewellery including earrings is not permitted for PE activities.

Clubs

Clubs start week commencing Monday 7th September and details and permission slips etc. are included with this newsletter.

It is important that parental permission is sought for attendance at clubs and also we need to know if your child is not able to attend on a particular day. This is a safe guarding issue. Certain clubs have limited numbers, e.g. drawing club so please do make sure your child really does want to take part in the club as other children could take their place.

Home school agreement

We will be sending this out at the end of the week for you to discuss with your child as it deals with many expectations and school matters. This needs to be signed and returned to the school office by Monday 14th September. Also the parent/carer/visitor code of conduct is being sent out with the home school agreement for your information.

Playtimes

We are asking that children who would like to go on the field at playtimes (Years 2-5) have a spare pair of (old) joggers/trousers and trainers/shoes to change into as they can get very muddy. Please put these clothes in a named bag to hang on your child's peg.

Absence from school

Holiday requests are not authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances to the request. This is in accordance with our attendance policy and application must be made to the headteacher and is verified by our attendance officer.

A reminder that if your child is unwell and unable to come to school please let us know as soon as possible in the morning. If we do not hear from you we will be contacting you to find out where your child is. If your child has sickness and/or diarrhoea a period of **48 hours** must elapse before your child returns to school. This is for the safety of others.
