Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

NEW CLUB

To continue to refine and embed our approach to the teaching of reading and writing in the Early Years, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2.

Free School meals – please speak to Miss Scott if you think you may be eligible.

This is available for all children.

If your child is in Foundation and Key Stage 1 please still apply as you will be able to get help with things like uniform and school trips even though you currently don't pay for dinners due to universal free school meals. I have attached the link to the form below but if you aren't not sure please ask Miss Scott or the office as we can help – you just need your National Insurance number.

Application form for free school meals (leicestershire.gov.uk)

If your child is not registered for Free School Meals and you receive any of the following benefits your child may be able to get free school meals:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)



- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

Your child may also get free school meals if you get any of these benefits and your child is both:

- younger than the <u>compulsory age for starting school</u>
- in full-time education.

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2022.

NUT FREE

As you all know we are a nut free school. There are many items we see in packed lunches that have hidden nuts in them, e.g. chocolate spread and Kinder Buenos so please check.

<u>Tt is vital that we remain vigilant to what the children bring in for snack and lunch as we have a child and a member of staff in school with a severe nut allergy.</u>
