The BeSkilled Trust Duathlon Challenge

Thirteen of our children took part the BeSkilled Duathlon Challenge on 11th April at Hicks Lodge in Ashby. The challenge involved two back to back events that give a total of 5 miles of ground to be covered - a four mile off road cycle challenge and a 1 mile run around the lake. The Year 6 competitors competed in three back to back events over 10 miles. The first was a four mile off road cycle challenge followed by a 1 mile run, followed by a timed bike ride around the lake which involved the children completing as many laps as they could within 30 minutes.

In the Year 2 and 3 Duathlon Ruben came 2nd and Cole 3rd. In the Year 4 and 5 Duathlon Charlie, Oscar and Will came 1st, 2nd and 3rd and in the Year 6 team Ava came 3rd and Jack 6th. The Year 6 competitors commented that the bike route was extremely bumpy and slippery!
