The new systems seem to be working quite well. Unfortunately, I don't think there are any perfect solutions but please know that every decision I have made I have spent time thinking about how to make everything as safe and time efficient for all. I do want to take the time to thank all the staff in school. What you don't see inside school is the adaptations staff have had to make to their day. As well as teaching and supporting the children, they are now cleaning the classrooms at lunchtime and playtimes, as well as resources after use. Mrs Lavine is also now cleaning for a 2 hour slot during the day. This is a lot on top of their usual workload and I thank them all for everything they are doing.

Staggered starts and ends of the day

This seems to be working ok but please arrive at the allotted time, please don't come too early. At pick up please can anyone with more than one child move away from the barriers and stand socially distanced on the bottom playground. The children will come out to you there. This will hopefully give more space by the barriers. We can only give it a go!

Handwashing outside

This is not ideal but it is really important that this is done preferably before the children enter the building. As it gets colder please make sure that the children have a good coat/ hat etc. on. If it is really really raining we will sanitise before entry then get the children to wash their hands inside as soon as they are in.

PE Kits

As I mentioned in my previous letter the children may come home in PE kit. This is largely due to the timings and staggered starts and end of the day. The staff are under a lot of time pressure and it is eating into their PE time. Here is the timetable when the children need their kit. After their last session of the week please give it a wash ready for the next week. Please make sure the children have full outdoor PE kit, they will be going out unless the weather is really terrible so they do need their joggers and hoodies.

ELSA

As you know Mrs Robe has left and Miss Snowdon will be taking over the role of ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) on parts of Thursday and Friday afternoons. There is a child referral form for the child to refer themselves and the teachers can too but if you have any worries and would like Miss Snowdon to potentially work with your child please ask the class teacher at parents evening to see if anything more can be done in class or whether they need to be referred.

Harvest

Please can your child bring a donation of a non perishable item on Monday 28th September to school. The donations will be for the foodbank. It needs to be something they are able to carry up to church themselves. Vicar Louise will lead an act of worship for each bubble during the day (with a clean in between) in church. No parents will be allowed but each class will be sharing something they have done in class during each individual session. We are going to try to put a little video together to share with you.

Google Classroom

One thing I will be looking at in detail over the next few weeks is our contingency plan in the event of another lockdown and how home or blended learning will look for us. As part of that I have already decided that we will not use WEDUC home learning but to move to use google classroom. The children will be given their logins next week and be trained on how to use it. If we do go into lockdown the majority of the learning will be based online and will run more formally. More details will be given once everything is finalised

Reading

Reading is something we are looking at as a school this year and we have already noticed for some children, since coming back to school that they are struggling with their reading.

The way we have traditionally sorted reading books at Belton is that they are banded/levelled books approximately to year 3 or 4 depending on the child, then they move to free reading. This is something over time we will be moving away from.

What the support staff have been doing is benchmarking the children's reading.

This is a system to see exactly where the children are, not just their fluency but aspects of their comprehension. What we are finding is that even children who can read fluently they are not comprehending as well. So this year we are hoping to buy into a banded scheme which will run all the way from Reception to Year 6. This will help us and the children target the areas the children need more support with and improving their reading and comprehension.

The children on free reading will still have a free reading book but will also have banded book. This change won't be happening straight away but we will be moving towards that as the year goes on.

Reading bookmarks are to continue as normal but also KS2 will also have reading passports to help encourage some extra reading. The class teachers will give more information to the children.
